BottleDrop customers helping support Eco-Earth Restoration Project

Donation to Salem Parks Foundation will help repair and restore sculpture in Riverfront Park

Clackamas, Ore. -- The Oregon Beverage Recycling Cooperative (OBRC), parent organization to [BottleDrop](#), announced a \$2,500 donation to the [Salem Parks Foundation](#), a Salem, Ore. based nonprofit focused on improving, enhancing, and advocating for the park system of Salem. The donation, generated through BottleDrop's [Containers for Change](#) program, will be used by the nonprofit to repair and restore the Eco-Earth Globe, a 26-foot diameter mosaic sculpture in Salem's Riverfront Park.

"When we see a group of motivated volunteers working together to enhance their community, we want to be part of that energy," said Eric Chambers, external relations director at the Oregon Beverage Recycling Cooperative. "Salem's Earth Globe mosaic, like Oregon's Bottle Bill, increases awareness of our connection to the environment, and reminds us of our responsibility to be good stewards."

BottleDrop's Containers for Change program provides Oregonians with an easy way to donate funds from their bottles and cans to excellent nonprofits operating in communities around the state. BottleDrop customers can participate by simply leaving their bag tag stickers off of their Green Bags, and dropping them off at any BottleDrop facility, like one of the three BottleDrop Redemption Centers in Salem, Ore.
