





Q2 - 2020

Extraordinary times call for extraordinary effort and leadership. With an ongoing global pandemic, this quarter presented many challenges. OBRC met the challenge, and made Oregon the only state to continue operating its bottle deposit and return program through the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic.

A few highlights of what we accomplished in Q2:

- OBRC operated an emergency bottle return operation at the Portland Plant, which at its peak returned \$17,500 per day back into the hands of Oregon residents in need.
- Redeployed resources from servicing retailers to staffing Redemption Centers to keep them open, while closely following guidance of state and local health officials to ensure the safety of our staff and our customers.
- Harnessed the power of our customers to raise \$200,000 in community donations for Oregon Food Bank.
- Added just under 84,000 new accounts and processed an average of 22,000 Green Bags each day. We also hit a milestone of over half a million total accounts.




Return Volume by Container Type (Q2 2020) + Return Location (2019)


We processed an average of 22,078 Green Bags daily throughout Q2, which is by far our busiest quarter ever.








Q2 Return Volume by Redemption Center + Material

Featured Fundraiser: Oregon Food Bank

Oregon Food Bank (OFB) distributes food through a statewide network of 21 regional food banks and approximately 1,400 food assistance sites. More than 860,000 people rely on OFB each year, and in times of crisis, that number grows. In April and May, BottleDrop customers donated \$175,000 in container deposits, and OBRC donated an additional \$25,000 for a total contribution of \$200,000 to benefit OFB.
