Oregon's first-in-the-nation Bottle Bill celebrated its 50th Anniversary in 2021. From the beginning, the Oregon system was unique in that it called on the beverage industry to serve as both operator and steward of the redemption program. Now some 50 years later, it continues to deliver some of the best recycling outcomes in the nation – and the world.



For the past three decades, I've served in many capacities related to our stewardship and operational programs, the past 15 years as OBRC's President. I've seen the Bottle Bill grow and evolve, both in the range of containers it includes and in convenience for Oregonians returning and redeeming those containers. It has been a profound honor to work in an institution that so embodies Oregon's values and innovative nature.

Last fall I announced that 2022 will be my final year serving as the President of OBRC. I'm thrilled that the OBRC Board has selected Jules Bailey, our current Executive Vice President, to serve as OBRC's next President, beginning in 2023. Jules brings the creativity, innovation, and administrative acumen necessary to continue achieving the environmental and recycling outcomes we enjoy.

The Bottle Bill unites Oregonians, with public policy, industry, and consumers all working toward a common goal. We're proud of what we've accomplished here together, and we're well-poised to build on this progress over the next 50 years.

2021 BY THE NUMBERS

Counted On by Oregonians

At its core, Oregon's Bottle Bill is surprisingly straightforward: Consumers who return qualifying OR 10-cent beverage containers get a dime back for each one. Those dimes add up, with nearly 2 billion containers redeemed through OBRC in 2021, representing \$199.3 million in total refunds paid to Oregonians.

The True Power of a Dime

The simple math doesn't tell the whole story. For 50 years, Oregon's Bottle Bill has dramatically reduced litter and improved Oregon's environment. In addition, through OBRC's innovation and partnerships, Oregonians get even more from their Bottle Bill.



Nonprofits across Oregon supercharge their fundraising efforts through BottleDrop Give, collectively raising over \$5 million in 2021 with bottles and cans.



OBRC unveiled major improvements to the BottleDrop mobile app in 2021. Customers can now access a digital account card, view detailed account and bag processing activity, search for locations to make returns, and update account information.



Through OBRC's partnership with the Northwest Grocery Association, 158,925 BottleDrop account holders got an extra 20% bonus in 2021 when using funds from their containers at participating retail stores. That's a 31% increase from 2020.



Thousands of Oregon families use funds from their containers to save for education by linking their BottleDrop accounts with their Oregon College Savings Plans.



Green and Blue Bags used in our bulk recycling program are sent back to the manufacturer – located right here in the U.S. – to be recycled into new bags again.



OBRC's Refillables program remains the only statewide program of its kind, and now includes nine partners and 104 beverage options.



INCREASING ACCESS TO BOTTLEDROP

Expanding Across Oregon

The BottleDrop network continued to expand access across Oregon in 2021. In addition to a number of new bag drop locations in the Portland area, we added new bag drop locations along the coast in Florence, Warrenton, and Tillamook and purchased property in Coos Bay, which will become a full-service Redemption Center. Yamhill County also got its first bag drop location in Newberg. And we got creative with our retail partners to open new BottleDrop Express facilities within the existing Redemption Center convenience zones in Medford, Beaverton, Salem, and Bend, providing additional options and capacity in those areas.

The percentage of containers returned through the BottleDrop network has been climbing steadily, with the remaining balance being returned through retail stores.




It's been a long-time priority to improve the experience and efficiency of recycling efforts in our community. Prior to getting a BottleDrop, people were avoiding the can returns. Since August, when our new BottleDrop opened, the entire North Coast region received a safer, more enjoyable – and thereby more utilized – and efficient bottle return process. OBRC launched Containers for Change in 2021 to direct funds from containers donated through Green Bags to organizations operating in the spirit of the Bottle Bill.

\$28,000 donated to warming shelters throughout the state via the OBRC **Emergency Fund**.

OBRC engaged the Emergency Fund twice in 2021 to provide immediate support during extreme weather.


"It's been amazing to see the progress that comes from just one year of hard work," Ceci said. "It makes Eli and me even more excited about studying hard and going to college!"




DOING TWICE THE GOOD

Celebrating the Bottle Bill's 50th Anniversary was a 2021 highlight. OBRC marked the occasion by sponsoring an exhibit at the Oregon Historical Society and joining the museum for a panel discussion. We also launched a statewide Hidden Bottle Hunt, engaging thousands of Oregonians in a fun outdoor activity, cracking clues to locate six commemorative bottles hidden in some of the special places the Bottle Bill helps protect. And finally, we produced a video featuring people across the state wishing the Bottle Bill a happy birthday by making music with bottles and cans.



Oregonians who redeem their containers responsibly get to enjoy the system's strong environmental and recycling outcomes at almost no cost—and at no taxpayer expense. That's because Oregon's Bottle Bill is an advanced form of Extended Producer Responsibility, where OBRC serves as the statewide not-for-profit operational steward on behalf of the beverage industry, and we invest the value of unclaimed refunds directly into the operation and expansion of the network. Additionally, beverage distributors make significant financial contributions to cover the remaining costs of the program.

Looking Ahead

At OBRC, our mission is clear and our aspirations are always high. This will be another year of growth, increased access, and improved technology. Our goals include:

Continue to improve the BottleDrop App to enhance the consumer experience, make access to account funds easier than ever, and continue to provide detailed accounting.

Inspire change beyond our borders by continuing to share Oregon's success story with governing bodies across the country (and around the world), and participate in pilot projects like our BottleBank partnership in San Francisco.

Commence operations at our newest Redemption Center in Coos Bay, which will give South Coast residents access to the BottleDrop network.

Open the Glisan 2.0 facility in NE Portland and move our existing Glisan Redemption Center to this new, state-of-theart facility nearby, where we will deploy new technology that will reduce lines and improve the customer experience.

Expand community partnerships that provide new redemption access for people who redeem containers on a daily (or near-daily) basis.

Use Cleaner R-99 fuel in OBRC's route operations to reduce emissions.

Expand the BottleDrop network in communities across Oregon by providing new bag drop locations in partnership with retailers.

Continue to serve as a major statewide employer, providing a range of career opportunities supporting the success of Oregon's Bottle Bill.

Build on our success of ensuring that containers remain food-grade materials for high-quality domestic recycling, closing the bottle-to-bottle and can-to-can loop as tightly as possible.

Build on the success of BottleDrop Refillables by assisting brands and beverage types interested in the program and exploring the possibility of launching a refillable wine bottle partnership.

Serve as a critical supporter of communities across Oregon through continued growth in BottleDrop Give, the OBRC Containers for Change program and Emergency Fund, and the BottleDrop Fund at the Oregon Community Foundation.

Oregonians can be proud of their Bottle Bill and what it does for the environment, for our community, and for our economy. And the Oregon Beverage Recycling Cooperative is proud to serve as the industry steward and operator of the Bottle Bill, providing a system that processes every container returned for the highest-quality recycling right here in Oregon and the United States.
