Q1 - 2021 Oregon Beverage Recycling Cooperative

With the pandemic ongoing, Q1 2021 required continued flexibility as OBRC and BottleDrop responded to the crisis. The suspension of retail returns in Q4 2020 continued throughout Q1, easing slightly in February and March, as some counties briefly moved into lower COVID-19 risk categories. BottleDrop remained open throughout, and a reliable redemption option, continuing to absorb a higher percentage of return volumes.

While pandemic-related challenges persisted, growth in the BottleDrop network continued. We added five new Green and Blue Bag drop locations in Q1, enhancing access and convenience. We also improved the customer experience with significant updates to our BottleDrop mobile app, with even more app improvements ahead on the near horizon.

We also launched our Containers for Change program in January, making it even easier for Green Bag customers to support nonprofits

and foundations, and we activated the Emergency Fund during February's severe winter weather, providing critical aid to eight warming shelters across the state.

Growth in BottleDrop Give also reached new heights in Q1, breaking the record for most Blue Bags processed in a quarter (109,320, up 103% over Q1 2020). That, combined with other high-volume fundraisers, resulted in over \$1 million raised for Oregon nonprofits in a single quarter for the third consecutive quarter. Q1 saw growth in volume, access and customer convenience and OBRC's positive reach in communities across Oregon.



Return Volume by Container Type





Q1 2021 - 88% of containers were returned through the BottleDrop network, which includes Redemption Centers and Green Bag drop locations, while 12% were returned at retail stores. That is above 2020's average of 75.3% and shows the popularity of BottleDrop services, as well as the ongoing impact of the return-to-retail suspensions brought on by COVID-19.

% Returns Through BottleDrop


