Q4 - 2021

Oregon Beverage Recycling Cooperative

The final quarter of 2021 concluded another record-breaking year at OBRC. We surpassed 800,000 BottleDrop account holders during Q4, who collectively dropped off 2.5 million bags during the quarter, bringing the annual total to an astounding 11.2 million bags processed.

The BottleDrop network also continued to expand in Q4, opening an additional three bag drop locations, bringing the statewide total to 83 drop sites. One recent drop site was opened in Tillamook during the latter part of Q4, just 20 miles north of Pacific City, where Oregon's Bottle Bill was first imagined by an engaged and passionate citizen, Richard Chambers, over 50 years ago. Bringing modern redemption options to the birthplace of the Bottle Bill was an enjoyable Q4 highlight.

And we continued to help nonprofit service providers throughout the quarter.

Over 4,700 nonprofits now participate in BottleDrop Give, which collectively raised over \$5 million through bottle and can donations in 2021. We supported those efforts in Q4 through our annual Holiday Give match campaign. Over 650 nonprofits participated this year, raising nearly \$170,000. Finally, we engaged the OBRC Emergency Fund during the severe cold weather at the end of December, providing immediate financial support to 20 warming centers and shelters across Oregon.





Return Volume by Container Type




% Returns Through BottleDrop




Q4 2021 - During the quarter, 77% of containers were returned through the BottleDrop network, which includes Redemption Centers and Green Bag drop locations, while 23% were returned at retail stores. For the year, 81.4% of containers have been returned through our network as the popularity of BottleDrop's Green Bag program continues to grow.

Holiday Give 2021

We hosted our fifth annual Holiday Give campaign during Q4, which included a 20% match on funds raised as well as a social media contest. More than 650 nonprofits participated this year, returning over 18,000 Blue Bags and generating 145 online donations during the 2-week match period. Including our contributions, we helped Oregon nonprofits raise nearly \$170,000 during our most successful Holiday Give yet.
