

2023 began with a busy and exciting first guarter. The BottleDrop network expanded with the addition of three new retail bag drop sites—two in Portland (Trader Joe's on SE Cesar Chavez Blvd. and Safeway on SE Powell Blvd.) and one in Prineville (Ericksons Thriftway), which was the city's first bag drop door location. Green Bag access in Crook County's largest city has been one of OBRC's expansion priorities, and the site was immediately popular with consumers in the area. The guarter ended with 954,326 Green Bag account holders, marking a 2.9% increase during Q1.

OBRC has seen a significant increase in participation over the past year. The Cooperative ended Q1 with 307 members and participants, a 14.6% increase over the number of members and participants at the end of Q1 2022. Increased participation in the Cooperative helps ensure a streamlined consumer experience across Oregon that facilitates improved access to the BottleDrop network and its programs.

Container return volume during Q1 2023 (374.30 million) was substantially similar to return volume during the same guarter the previous year (377.13 million), showing a decrease of less than one percent. Green Bag return volume during Q1 2023 (2.70 million bags) showed a slight increase over Q1 2022 (2.68 million bags).

Growth also continued in the BottleDrop Give program, with 269 additional Oregon nonprofits signing up to raise funds through container redemption. The Q1 2023 data was adjusted to remove duplicates between Blue Bag fundraisers and high-volume plant fundraisers, so the total number of participating nonprofits (5,160) appears less than the number at the end of Q4 2022 (5,565), despite the program continuing to grow during the guarter.




Quarterly Returns Through the BottleDrop Network

Return Volume by Container Type




% Returns Through BottleDrop




Q1 2023 - The percentage of containers returned through the BottleDrop network increased slightly during Q1 as Oregon's container return system continued to stabilize from the Covid-19 era return to retail suspensions that ended midway through 2021. In total, 79.4% of containers returned during Q1 were returned through the BottleDrop network.

The BottleDrop network ended the quarter with 14.0% more account holders than it had at the end of Q1 2022 (837,174) and 39.7% more account holders than it had at the end of Q1 2021 (683,159).

Give Growth

The first quarter of 2023 marked the 11th consecutive time nonprofits have raised over \$1 million in a single quarter through BottleDrop Give. The all-time raised total crested \$23 million during Q1, and more than half of that amount (over \$14 million) has been raised since Q1 2020. BottleDrop Give continues to be a critical fundraising pathway for nonprofits in every Oregon community.

Statewide Refillable Programs in US

A Great Way to Enjoy Oregon's Craft Beverages

During Q1, OBRC's Refillable program sent a full truckload of bottles to be washed and made available for reuse. The first quarter of 2023 also marked continued program expansion, with Refill partners making additional unique beverage options in Refillable bottles available across Oregon. There are now 137 unique stock-keeping units (SKUs) registered in the Refillable program, up from 112 at the end of Q4.
