Oregon Beverage Recycling Cooperative

The BottleDrop network added its 100th bag drop location in Brookings (Fred Meyer) during Q2, adding easy access to the Green Bag program for south coast residents. The quarter also brought new bag drop access in Ashland (Food Co-op) and The Dalles (Fred Meyer), another longtime geographic expansion priority for OBRC.

The quarter also saw increases in both the total number of containers returned and the number of Green and Blue Bags processed, both quarter-over-quarter and year-over-year. In total, 424.4 million containers were returned through the BottleDrop network during Q2 2023, an 8.3% increase over the same quarter the previous year. Expansion to the network and the convenience of the Green and Blue Bag programs spurred significant growth in volume. BottleDrop's 984,698 account holders returned 3.1 million Green and Blue Bags during the quarter, a 10.5% increase in the number of bags returned compared to the same period in 2022.

OBRC's growth in members and participants also continued during the quarter, with six new members and participants, bringing the total to 313. OBRC's members continued their stewardship efforts through the Cooperative during Q2. By providing a matching campaign centered around Earth Week, the BottleDrop Give program helped 660 participating nonprofits across Oregon raise over \$188,000 to enrich important causes and communities across the state. This was OBRC's 3rd annual Earth Week matching campaign, and it provided an excellent opportunity for nonprofit organizations to raise funds while sharing the redemptive power of container refunds.







Return Volume by Container Type




Container Return Volume Year-Over-Year

The BottleDrop network ended the quarter with 13.5% more account holders than it had at the end of Q2 2022 (867,472) and 34.7% more account holders than it had at the end of Q2 2021 (731,097).

Earth Week Give

OBRC hosted its 3rd annual Earth Week Give campaign during Q2-23. In total, 660 nonprofits participated, raising nearly \$153,000 through Blue Bags and online donations from Green Bag accounts. OBRC's Containers for Change program provided a 20% match for funds raised during the campaign and hosted a "Redemption Story" contest where nonprofits shared powerful stories about how container redemption through BottleDrop Give has helped them improve the lives of the Oregonians they serve. Earth Week Give was a big success, with over \$188,000 raised for nonprofits during the effort.

OBRC's Refillable program made continued strides during Q2. With a successful test on a new washable label for Refillable bottles, the program continues to improve its operational efficiency by making the bottle washing process much easier. The quarter ended with the same number of Refill partners and unique stock-keeping units (SKUs) in the program, but the types and varieties of beverages included in the program changed with the seasons, with winter drinks making way for spring and summer styles.
