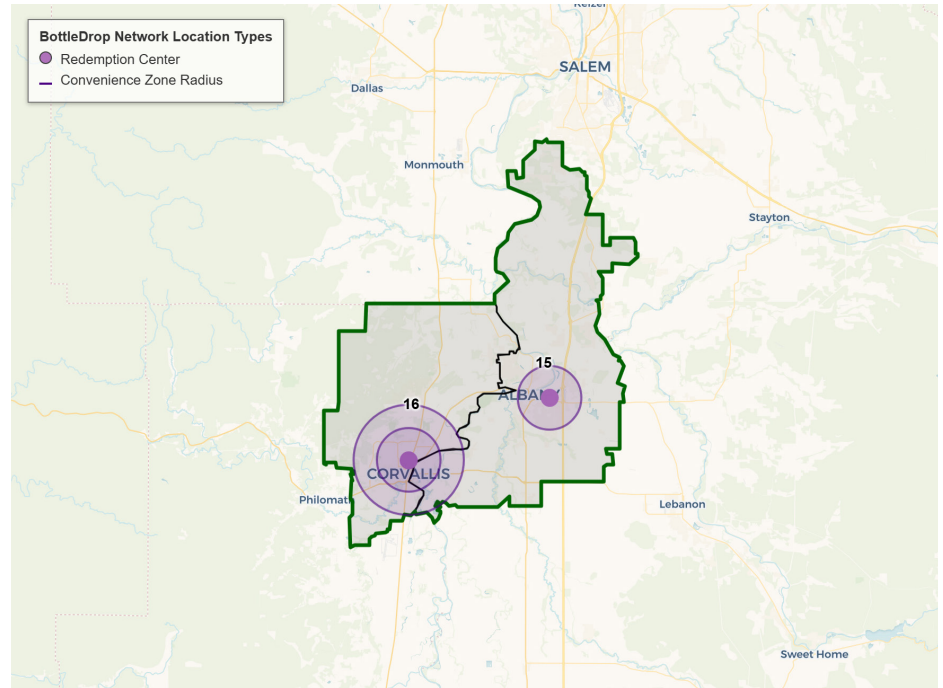

Executive Summary

The second half of 2025 saw stable redemption activity and continued growth in BottleDrop's Green and Blue Bag program across Oregon. Redemption volumes remained consistent with YoY 2024 levels, while bag program participation increased 4.62% statewide. This trend underscores continued consumer preference for account-based redemption and highlights ongoing opportunities to expand convenient access to the bag program throughout the state.

District 20 in Clackamas County recorded the largest gain in participation at 14.5%, while District 11 in Salem experienced the largest decline at -6.8%. Animal welfare organizations dominate BottleDrop Give fundraising, and BrightSide Humane Society of Redmond led the pack! Statewide, the BottleDrop network accounted for 87% of returns, while in-store redemption represented 13% of returns.

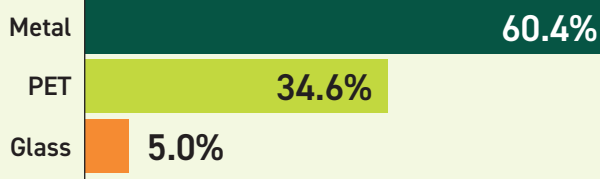

TOTAL REDEMPTION CENTER VOLUME PROCESSED*

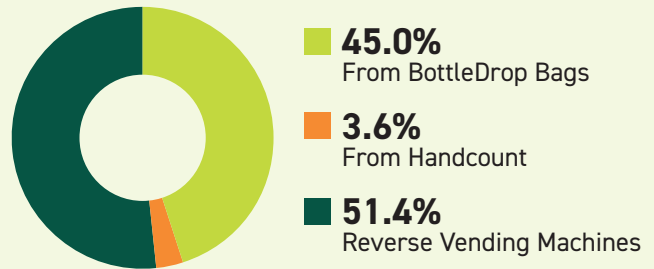

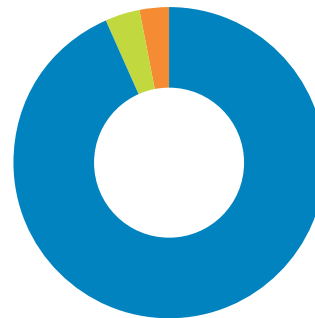
